COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Course Description: Geometry: Concepts and Connections (27.08210) is the second course in a sequence of three high school courses designed to ensure career and college readiness. This course is intended to enhance students' geometric, algebraic, graphical, and probabilistic reasoning skills. Students will apply their algebraic and geometric reasoning skills to make sense of problems involving geometry, trigonometry, algebra, probability, and statistics. Students will continue to enhance their analytical geometry and reasoning skills when analyzing and applying a deep understanding of polynomial expressions, proofs, constructions, rigid motions and transformations, similarity, congruence, circles, right triangle trigonometry, geometric measurement, and conditional probability.

Unit 2: Geometric Foundations, Unit 6: Circles

Construction and Proof Unit 7: Equations and Measurement

Unit 3: Congruence

Unit 9: Culminating Capstone Unit
